### Greetings,

Please accept this Letter of Support for the Coles Boulevard improvement project for the City of Portsmouth, Ohio. Coles Boulevard is the only major collector on the north part of town which serves many neighborhoods and businesses and is also the only designated hospital route for emergency vehicles coming from north of Portsmouth heading to the Southern Ohio Medical Center.

This segment of road has been in poor condition for many years and the cost to repair the whole segment has been a major obstacle for the City to overcome. The scope of work includes replacing the storm sewer, repairing sidewalk and curb, resurfacing the entire roadway and adding new pavement markings. We will also incorporate traffic calming measures such as RRFB crosswalks, curb extensions and striped edge lines.

We have received 2.8 million dollars from the Ohio Department of Transportation through the Small Cities and Systemic Safety programs and we received an additional \$300,000 from the Ohio Valley Regional Development Commission through the Surface Transportation Block Grant. This additional funding would greatly reduce the local cost for the project as the total project estimate is above 5.4 million dollars.
