## A BILL

- To require certain elements of the intelligence community to submit to the congressional intelligence committees a report with respect to biotechnology threats, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Elevating Bio-5 technology Threats Reporting Act".

## 1SEC. 2. REPORTING REQUIREMENT ON BIOTECHNOLOGY2THREATS WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN ELE-3MENTS OF THE INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY.

4 (a) REPORTING REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 5 June 30, 2025, the head of each covered element of the 6 intelligence community shall submit a separate report to 7 the congressional intelligence committees with respect to 8 biotechnology threats and intelligence activities related to 9 biotechnology threats.

10 (b) MATTERS INCLUDED.—Each report under sub11 section (a) shall include, with respect to each covered ele12 ment of the intelligence community, the following:

(1) A description of any gaps that exist with respect to intelligence activities that impede such element from fully targeting, collecting, and analyzing
intelligence related to biotechnology threats.

17 (2) A description of any existing formal mecha18 nisms by which the intelligence community provides
19 intelligence and support with respect to bio20 technology threats to—

21 (A) departments and agencies of the Fed22 eral government outside the intelligence commu23 nity;

24 (B) the governments of foreign countries;25 and

2	tions.

3 (3) An assessment of any existing mechanisms
4 and manners by which the intelligence community
5 consults with biotechnology experts and other out6 side experts with related expertise.

7 (c) COVERED ELEMENTS OF THE INTELLIGENCE
8 COMMUNITY.—For purposes of this section, the covered
9 elements of the intelligence community are as follows:

10 (1) The Central Intelligence Agency.

11 (2) The Defense Intelligence Agency.

12 (3) The Federal Bureau of Investigation.

13 (4) The National Security Agency.

14 (5) The Office of the Director of National Intel-

15 ligence.

(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the terms "congressional intelligence committees", "intelligence community", and "intelligence" each have the meaning given
such terms in section 3 of the National Security Act of
1947 (50 U.S.C. 3003).
